# TOP TIPS



## Creating your character

Did you know, junk modelling isn't always as eco-friendly as you might think!

When making your characters out of recyclable materials, please follow these top tips:

- Find materials that are the colour you need, rather than using paint
- Don't use glitter or stickers, as these products aren't recyclable
- Instead of using glue, join the parts of your model together with string, blu tack or butterfly clips
- If you use tape, make sure to remove this before recycling your junk models or buy recyclable tape
- Can you add any other natural materials (e.g. sticks, straw, shells or stones) to your animal rather than unrecyclable materials?

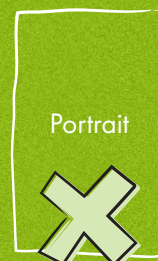
Have a practice run through, and time yourselves – make sure that you can get through your script in no more than three minutes
